Invitation to a public meeting to Celebrate the centenary of the founding of the Ghadar Party in 1913

Dear Friend

We would like to invite your organisation to participate in large numbers at a meeting to celebrate 100 years since the formation of the Ghadar Party in 1913. The meeting is being held in Delhi, at the Gujarati Samaj, on September 15, 2-6 p.m.

The political significance of the founding of the Ghadar Party and its thoughts and actions is indisputable and its centenary is indeed a cause for celebrations for all of us who are fighting for the liberation of the Indian people.

The word Ghadar signifies a revolt – the movement that began in 1913, a continuation of the 1857 Ghadar, aimed at bringing about a revolution in India in order to secure liberation from British Control. The headquarters of the Ghadar Party were established in San Francisco and the Party published their own paper known as the Ghadar, and founded an institution known as the Yugantar Ashram, the object of the institution being to instill patriotic feelings in young Indians and train them for a rising in India."

Today, the Indian people continue to be oppressed and exploited, denied their very basic rights, and the system benefits only a minority which holds the reins of power in its hands. All of us who are deeply concerned about this situation must come together to deliberate and unite in action to change the situation in favour of the workers, toilers and entire people of India. It will be a fitting celebration when all of us, who are fighting for the cause of emancipation and empowerment of the people come together on this issue.

We invite you to fully participate in the organisation of the event, the campaign to spread the message and to contribute to this meeting of all patriotic Indians on September 15.

The true celebration of the Ghadar Party of 1913 lies in carrying forward the tradition of fighting against the oppression of the masses of working people across the country.
